ACP-EU Water Partnerships - Newsletter

In 2010 the EU earmarked €40 million of the ACP-EU Water Facility to support water partnership projects. These are not-for-profit partnerships intended to: "develop capacity in the ACP water & sanitation sector, leading to better water and sanitation governance and management, and to the sustainable development and maintenance of infrastructure".

The European Commission (EC) is awarding grants to partnerships in African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries selected through a restricted call procedure. ACP-EU water partnerships must last for a minimum of 2 years and a maximum of 5 years. Each grant awarded to a partnership must be between a minimum of €250,000 and a maximum of €1,000,000.

Those interested in applying for grants and participating in water partnerships should note that the deadline for the submission of concept notes (4 pages maximum) is 6^{th} October 2010.

PSIRU at the University of Greenwich has created the www.acp-eu-waterpartnerships.org website to support the ACP-EU water partnerships. This website helps water utilities, local authorities and civil society organisations access and use EU aid to build not-for-profit ACP-EU water partnerships. It is funded under a contract from the European Commission.

You are not required to use this website to submit a proposal. For example, you can develop a partnership with your existing contacts. However, this website and PSIRU can help you find partners, draft concept notes and full proposals, and receive advice and information, if you find that useful. What you can find in www.acp-eu-waterpartnerships.org

The <u>www.acp-eu-waterpartnerships.org</u> website contains information on ACP-EU Water Partnerships and allows you to register as a partner, find partners online and develop your proposal(s) for a partnership.

By <u>registering</u> as a partner, you can find partners online and potential partners can contact your organisation. Registration is free, fast and easy, but is necessary to find partners online. Once you have identified who you would like to be your partner, you can contact them by sending an email. When you and your partner(s) agree on creating a partnership, you can record the details of the partnership proposal online. This will help us help you develop your concept note and full proposal. By registering as a partner, your organisation contact details are made available to other registered partners who will be able to contact you and propose partnerships. You also allow us to send you relevant information to ACP-EU water partnerships and offer our advice and support.

Instructions on how to register as a partner, find partners online and develop partnership proposals online are available on the <u>Help</u> page. For further assistance, contact: <u>e.lobina@gre.ac.uk</u> (+44 208 331 8476).

Please note that recording a partnership on www.acp-eu-waterpartnerships.org is not sufficient to submit concept notes and full proposals to the European Commission. Concept notes and full proposals can only be submitted to the European Commission by registered mail, private courier service or by hand-delivery (the postal addresses are indicated in the Guidelines for Grant Applicants). The deadline for submitting concept notes is 6th October 2010.
