ETUC calls on affiliates to use collective bargaining to close gender pay gap

Europe

The ETUC has called for more urgent action to close the gender pay gap across Europe. On average women earn 15% less than men but this gap rises to 20% in some countries. The ETUC believes that collective bargaining is the main instrument to be used to tackle pay inequalities and says that particular action needs to be taken to deal with the "wage penalty" attached to part-time working. Pay equality is a central demand in the ETUC's fair pay campaign.
