

Prison Overcrowding The FACTS!

FACT! Data from the Council of Europe show that, over the past decade, the prison population in the EU27 has been increasing, to currently stand at more than 600 000 prisoners: www.epsu.org/prisons

FACT! There are, on average, 25% more detainees than the facilities were designed for

FACT! Prison staff are rated as being among the highest

FACT! Overcrowding affects the ability to control crime and violence, and the spread of contagious diseases

FACT! Overcrowding is a major factor in the high turnover of prison medical staff, which causes further risks in healthcare, and in security

FACT! Overcrowding creates competition for limited resources

FACT! Overcrowding leads to aggression between inmates and against staff

FACT! Overcrowding can lead to higher rates of illness and even suicide

FACT! Overcrowding severely impedes rehabilitation
