Green Paper and public consultation

- Green Paper on the European Workforce for Health (Dec 2008)
- Followed by a public consultation and a series of policy dialogues in 2009-10
- Most pressing issue: Shortage of health workforce now and in the future





Shortage of health workforce in the EU

By 2020: approximately 1.000.000* health workers missing

This means that almost 15% of the necessary care will not be covered

The figure of 1.000.000 doubles if longterm care and ancillary health professions are taken into account

New Skills and Jobs Communication

Priority 2: equipping people with the right skills for employment

- Developing labour market intelligence and skills governance
- Providing the right mix of skills
- Matching people's skills and job opportunities, and capitalising on Europe's potential jobs
- Enhancing geographical mobility throughout the EU
- Reaping the potential of migration



New Skills and Jobs Communication

Action: The Commission, in cooperation with Member States, will develop by 2012 an action plan to address the gap in the supply of health workers. The action plan will be accompanied by a Joint Action under the Health Programme on forecasting health workforce needs and workforce planning.

Council Conclusions of 7 Dec 2010 on investing in Europe's health workforce of tomorrow

Member States and the Commission are invited to: develop an action plan providing options to support the development of MS health workforce policies, in the areas of the assessment of competence profiles, the improvement of planning methodologies taking into account identified health needs, CPD and recruitment and retention strategies, and to tackle the key challenges for the health workforce throughout the EU in the medium and long-term perspectives;

include in the work plan of the Health Programme a joint action providing a platform for cooperation between MS on forecasting health workforce needs and health workforce planning



Objectives of the action plan

- Improving workforce planning
- Working on skills and competences
- Helping the MS in equipping the health workforce with the right skills
- Improving retention and recruitment of health personnel
- Implementing the WHO code on international recruitment of health personnel
- Collection of high quality and comparable data



Instruments

A joint action under the Health **Programme** The Social Dialogue? A sectoral skills council? An more permanent structure (Observatory)? Bilateral agreements?
