MVP level of organising

Rough mapping First contacts, first tasks (=first 1on1s) Precise mapping

Get these 3 steps into every level of your organisation (teams, units, local branches, associations, etc.) and your organisation is 100% strike ready, when ever needed. Get the data and update it all the time = have conversations with your target groups.
